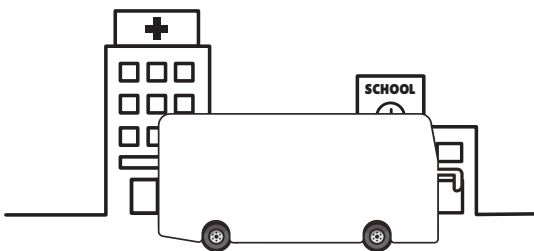
What is this summary about?



This summary is about how we can run local buses across South Yorkshire in the future.



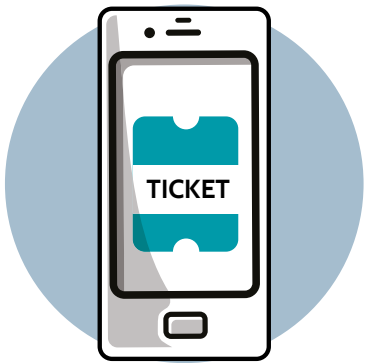
Bus services are very important because most of the public transport journeys people make across South Yorkshire are by bus.



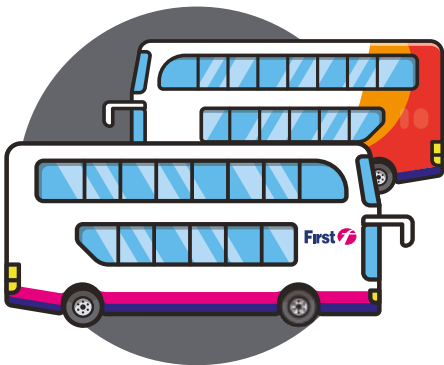
People use buses to get to work, school, doctors, hospitals and to visit friends and families.



People have told us that local buses in South Yorkshire are not working as well as they should.



For example, buses do not turn up when they should, there are fewer buses on our roads than there were years ago, and there are over 100 different bus tickets to choose from. All of this makes getting across South Yorkshire more difficult than it should be.



Buses are run by private companies like Stagecoach, First and TM Travel at the moment. They make all of the decisions on when and where buses go to and how much a journey should cost.



Bus companies also decide when to stop running services or to run less services along routes that do not make money.

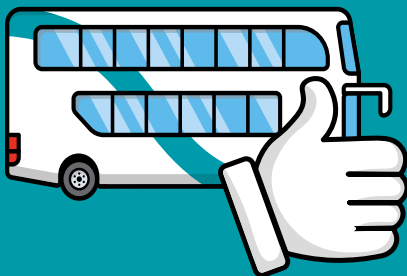
What are we asking for your views on?



We want to make the way buses are run for everyone in South Yorkshire better and fix the problems people are telling us about.

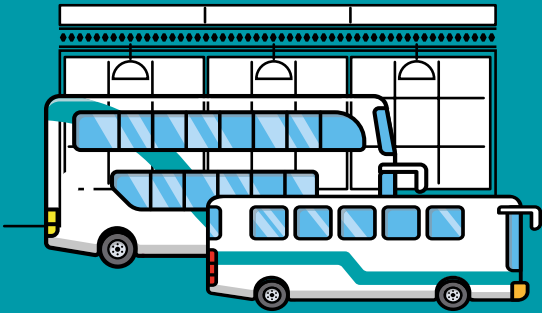


We have been given the power by the UK Government to decide how buses should be run across South Yorkshire.

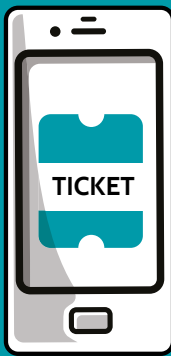


We think that taking control of the buses will help make things better. This is called 'Bus Franchising'.

This means that South Yorkshire Mayoral Combined Authority will run the bus network.



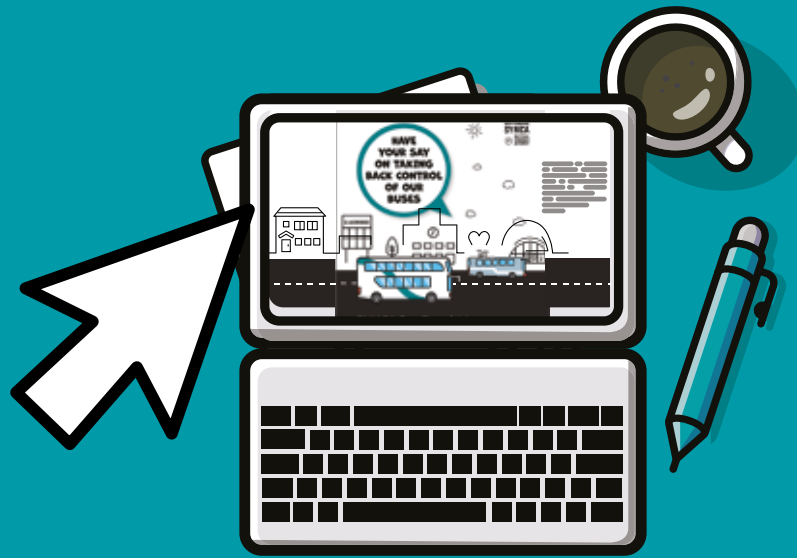
It will:

- Own the bus depots
- Own the buses
- Decide how much the bus fares will be
- Decide what routes the buses will take
- Decide what times the buses will arrive.

The consultation closes at 11.59pm on Wednesday 15th January 2025.

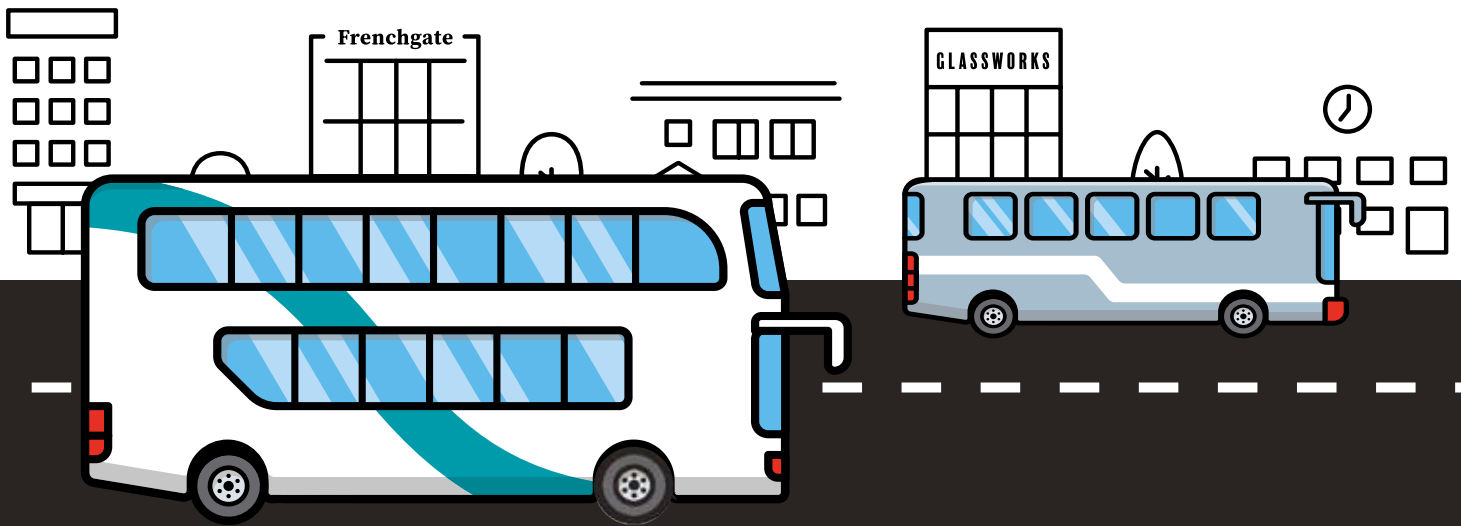
All responses from the public will be looked at and included in a final report.
