## Online Q&A session Wednesday 24 March - Summary

Context and Funding	<ul> <li>Sheffield City Region (SCR) was awarded £166m of Transforming Cities Fund (TCF) money for active travel and public transport schemes, the Rotherham Parkgate Scheme is one of these projects.</li> <li>SYPTE manage public transport services across South Yorkshire and are the promoter of the Scheme.</li> <li>SCR are providing the funding through the TCF.</li> <li>Rotherham Metropolitan Borough Council (RMBC) are the local authority covering the area and have carried out a Road Safety Audit for the scheme.</li> <li>After the consultation SYPTE will apply to RMBC for planning permission for the scheme.</li> </ul>

	<ol> <li>A new link road from Aldwarke Lane into Parkgate Shopping (Stadium Way), with a roundabout tie in at Aldwarke Lane.</li> <li>A new 300-space Park &amp; Ride facility at the Parkgate Shopping Tram Train terminus.</li> <li>Wider entry and exit on the A633 southern arm of Taylors Lane roundabout, and extension of the 2-lane sections in both directions.</li> <li>You can view our webpages for the proposals including the PDF here travelsouthyorkshire.com/parkgate</li> </ol>
Question	I understand that there are roadworks taking place in Greasbrough for the next 12 months which will result in traffic delays. Can you ensure that the construction for the Parkgate schemes (particularly Taylors Lane Roundabout) won't cause even more congestion and delays if they happen at the same time?
	There are RMBC roadworks taking place at B6089/Potter Hill/Greenside/Coach Lane/Main Street with delays possible until March 2022. The roadworks for Taylors Lane roundabout are not currently planned to take place until Spring/Summer 2022. Therefore, they should not occur at the same time. However, we will monitor the situation and liaise with RMBC if there is any cross over in timescales.
Timeframe	This is the pre-planning public consultation. Following the consultation, we will analyse the feedback and prepare a Statement of Community Involvement, which will be submitted alongside the planning application in May/June 2021.
